Steps to Build a Storage Shed

While most of us already know that a storage shed is a necessary addition to our property, some still struggle how to get started with building their storage shed. Let's give you the steps to getting this done to build a storage shed.

Time and again, having a <u>detailed plan</u> has proven that it is the best way to have a problem-free building project. A detailed plan takes out the guess work while you are building the project. It saves you money, time and effort. Also, before you even actually start to build your shed you will be able to prepare all the materials you need making it easy for you to just put them all together.



There are two things that you should do first, after you have your plans.

First, you must know where to build your shed. Avoid unlevelled land areas and make sure that there are no cables, wires, pipes running beneath it.

Second, check with your local planning and <u>zoning commission</u> and show them your building plans. This way, you can be assured that you will have no problems with the authorities later.

Now let's start building.

It is imperative that you have all your materials prepared before the actual building process. The wood of course is your most single important material. You also need tools like hammer, saw, nails, hinges, roof tacks and shingles. Based on your plans, measure your wood and cut them to size.

Prepare the land for your foundation as with any structure you build from the ground up. There are many types of foundations so decide if you want a concrete, gravel or pier foundation. Read more about <u>foundations here</u>.

Start with building your floor and then move on to the walls, windows and doors. Make sure the framing and the build at this point is secure before you move on to the roof. Don't skimp on the nails and make sure all areas are fastened securely without gaps. <u>Watch the process here</u>.

Now move on to the roof and build that structure according to your plans and install the right roofing material according to the weather in your area. There are many <u>shed roofing options here</u>.
